



## To Surveyors and Others

The Poor Law Commissioners having directed that a Survey shall be made of the Messuages, Lands, and other Hereditaments, liable to Poor-Rates, in the several Parishes of Westwood, Broughton Gifford, Great Chalfield, and Little Chalfield, in the Bradford Union, with a *Plan* upon the scale of 3 chains to an inch; and that a Valuation will be made of the said Messuages, Lands and other Hereditaments, according to their Annual Value;

*NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN*, That the GUARDIANS of the said Union are ready to receive Tenders from such Persons as may be willing to Contract for the making a SURVEY, PLAN and VALUATION, according to the directions of the said Commissioners, of any one or all of the above mentioned Parishes; such Tenders (specifying the time at which such Survey, Plan, and Valuation will be completed) to be sent, free of postage, to my offices at Bradford, at or before ten o'clock in the forenoon of the 30<sup>th</sup> of May instant, after which time no Tenders will be received.

The Board will not bind themselves to accept the lowest Tender; and the party whose Tender is accepted, will be required to enter into a Contract and Security for the due completion of such Survey, Plan and Valuation.
