

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Burbage



Burbage, in the Kinwardstone Hundred, Union of Pewsey, South Wilts., is a village, and parish, on the road from Marlborough to Salsibury, and the verge, on one hand, of Marlborough or Savernake Forest, and on the other of the bleak and dreary plain. The church, All Saints, has been entirely rebuilt except the tower; the living is a vicarial cure, annual net income £363, attached to a prebendal stall in Salisbury cathedral; the Most Noble the Marquis of Ailesbury is the Rector; the Rev. Thomas Stanton, M.A., is the vicar. A chapel for Wesleyans is the only Dissenting place of worship. There is a mixed National School for boys and girls. Population 1492; assessed property £5,922. Near this village, on the side of Great Bedwin, the Kennet and Avon canal passes under an old Roman road by a tunnel a quarter of a mile in length. On the canal are wharfs and brickworks. Burbage is 10 miles south-west from Hungerford, 71 from London, 6 south-east from Marlborough, 23 from Salisbury, and 17 from Devizes. The area of the parish is 3,246 acres 1 rood 28 poles; rateable value £4, 576 10s. Mr. Philip Pearce bequeathed the principal of £2,000, the interest of which is £100, of which £90 is to be given to the second poor annually about Christmas, and £10 for educational purposes.

Herapath, or Herepath, half a mile west, situated on a Roman military road, from which it takes its name, was, in the middle ages, the residence of the De Herapaths, who, in about the fourteenth century, migrated to the west of England; Steep Green is half a mile north; Wolfhall and Sutton, half a mile east; West Grafton 1 mile south-east; East Grafton 2 miles south-east; Westcot, half-mile east; Breach, three-quarters of a mile west; Coneygarth, 1 mile west; Marr Green, half a mile south; Bowden, half a mile north-west; Ram Alley, 1 mile north-west.
