

## Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Buttermere



BUTTERMERE, a township, parish, and small agricultural village in Hungerford Union, South Wilts., on the borders of this county, on an eminence overlooking the county of Berks., situated 12 miles from Marlborough south-east,  $5\frac{1}{2}$  south from Hungerford station, and 67 from London. The church is a plain edifice, and the living is a rectory, in the patronage of Winchester College, value £200[?]. There are two farms, and a few cottages, with 134 inhabitants, and 1,502 acres.

Letters are received by foot post from Hungerford, which is also the nearest money order office.
