CALNE TURNPIKE ROADS

Notice is hereby given, that the TOLLS (as this day reduced by order of the Trustee's) arising at the Toll Gates upon the Turnpike Roads, at Calne, in the county of Wilts, called or known by the names of Chilvester Hill, Quernerford, Chalk Street Lane, and Smellings Hill Gates, including the Tolls arising at the Weighing Engine and Quemerford, will be LET by Auction, to the best bidder, at a meeting of the Trustees of the said Turnpike Roads to be held at the house of MR. CHARLES PINNIGER, called LANDSDOWNE ARMS INN, in Calne aforesaid, on Wednesday the 1st day of December next, between the hours of eleven and two o'clock, for a term of three years, to commence from the first day of January next, at noon, (but to be determinable at the end of the first or second year at the option of either party), in the manner directed by the Acts passed in the third and fourth years of the reign of His Majesty King George the fourth, "For regulating Turnpike Roads," and such reduced Tolls will be put up at such sum as the Trustees shall think fit.

Whoever happens to be the best bidder, must at the same time pay in advance one twelfth part of the rent at which such Tolls may be let, and give security with sufficient sureties to the satisfaction of the said trustees of the said Turnpike Roads for payment of the rest of the money monthly by equal installments.
