Calne



This small but ancient borough and market town in situated on a stony hill, near the centre of the hundred to which it gives name, and upon the great road to Bath and Bristol, 90 miles distant from London west 19 east from Bath,30 north from Salisbury, and 7 from Devizes. Tradition derives the origin of Calne from the decline of a Roman statiat the present little hamlet of Studley 1½ mile to the west. It consists principally of one long unpaved and partially-lighted street, much improved of late in cleanliness and the house well-built of stone. At Calstone about three miles to the south-east, a number of springs gushing beautifully from the side of a hill and sufficient in their united strength to turn a corn mill at its foot, constitute the source of the Marlan, which after receiving another rivulet from Cherhill, flows through the centre, of this town on its way to join the Avon near Chippenham, a portion of which, in the centre of the town, has been arched over at the expence of the Marquis of Lansdowne, whereby a large and handsome space has been made. The parish is a vicarage, including the chapelries of Cherhill and Berwick Basset, the annual income £769 patron the treasurer of Sarum cathedral: population 4795, and the assessed property £26,502. The church dedicated to St. Mary, is spacious well pewed lighted with gas, and has a very beautiful tower. A new church is now being built in the hamlet of Studley in this parish to accommodate 500 persons, 400 sittings free, to be a district church for parts of the parishes of Calne, Chippenham, Bremhill, and Pewsham which is extra parochial. There are 4 Dissenting meetings, a free grammar school, and a hospital dedicated to St. John. The market is on Wednesday, and annual fairs are held 6th May and 29th September. A branch navigation from this place unites the Wiltshire and Berkshire canal with that of the Kennet and Avon, opening a convenient and extensive water carriage, not only to every part of the country, but to the ports of London and Bristol; yet this advantage has not prevented a considerable decline of late year in manufactures, principally Woollen Calne is a borough by prescription; its corporation, under the new Municipal Act composed of 15, members, who are privileged with a court of requests for small debts. By the reform Act one of its parliamentary representatives was curtailed, while the numbers of electors was increased to 307. The Poor Law Commissioners have constituted Calne the centre of a union, comprising 11 parishes and 8973 inhabitants.

The successive Marquises of Lansdowne have been considerable benefactors to the town, induced by the vicinity of their charming residence at Bowood.

The mansion there is handsome and extremely commodious, contains a number of good pictures, though less choice than the collection at Lansdowne House London, and commands an extensive prospect over a rich and lovely country embracing the town of Calne and the White Horse on Cherhill Hill and terminated by the bold and wood-crowned elevation of Roundway Hill and a range of the Marlborough Downs. The pleasure grounds cover about 70 acres laid out with the utmost taste and together with the park, which includes nine separate valleys, present strong-contrasted scenery, in every variety of beauty. Some of its conspicuous features are gingling rills and petrifying springs subterranean grottoes and the fine cascade rushing above them, in which art has effectually assumed the guise of nature in her wildest garb, a profusion of luxuriant trees, and a noble expanse of water, its limits concealed by advancing swells and woods. The warm sheltered situation and light rich soil of Studley are particularly congenial to culinary vegetables which great quantities are cultivated for the Bath market.

Compton House 2 miles east from Calne, has a beautiful view; and Whetham 3 miles south-west is an agreeable retirement. Within the parish is Cherhill Hill celebrated for its "white horse" which is visible to a great distance and for an encampment on its summit called Oldbury Castle

The titles of Viscount Calne and Calstone are borne by the Marquis of Lansdowne.
