



#### **1805**

A dispensation has passed the Great Seal, to enable the Rev Henry Goddard, Chaplain to the Marquis of Bath, to hold the Vicarage of Deverell-Longbridge, with the Rectory of Castle Eaton, in the Diocese of Sarum **Hampshire Chronicle Monday 10 June 1805**

#### **1825**

The Perpetual advowson and next Presentation to the Rectory of Castle Eaton, Wiltshire, the benefice is endowed with tithes, great and small, extending over 1800 acres of land, population 300; the annual income is £853 16s subject to the present Incumbent's life, who is aged 70. - £10,000. **The Ipswich Journal Saturday 14 May 1825**

#### **1829**

Preferred: --- The Rev Thomas Bullock to the Rectory of Castle Eaton, in the county of Wilts, at the presentation of Thomas Culley of Salthrop House, esq. **Reading Mercury Monday 11 May 1829**

#### **1846**

By the death of the Rev Thomas Bullock, the valuable Rectory of Castle Eaton, Wilts, is vacant. It is a remarkable fact that the Advowson has appertained to the family of Goddard, of Wilts, from the period of the Reformation to the present time. As early as 1550 Johanne Goddard presented Humfridus Golimore. In 1623 Edward Goddard, Esq, presented some clerk to the said Rectory; and again in 1627 the same Edward Goddard presented Johannes Hungerford. **Oxford Journal Saturday 7 November 1846**

The Rectory of Castle Eaton, near Cricklade, and the vicarage of Chiseldon, near Swindon. Vacant by the melancholy death of the late incumbent, the Rev Thomas Bullock, are of the annual value – the first of £650; the latter of £200. Castle Eaton is in the patronage of T Calley, Esq of Burderop House, and Chiseldon, in that of A Goddard, Esq. **Hampshire Advertiser Saturday 14 November 1846**

#### **1847**

The Rev John Sharpe, AB, has been instituted by the Lord Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol to the rectory of Castle Eaton, Wilts, void by the death of the Rev Thomas Bullock. Patron the Rev Edward Henry Aemilius Goddard. **Sherborne Mercury Saturday 8 May 1847**
