



Swindon & District Directory Extract 1928



Castle Eaton

Includes the tithings of Lushill and Blackford, and is in the Swindon Division of Wilts, Union, Petty Sessional Division and County Court District of Swindon and Diocese of Bristol, 4 miles from Cricklade G.W.R. Station, 5 from Highworth, and 9 from Swindon. The register of the Church of St. Mary dates from 1549. The living is a rectory of the annual value of £515, with residence. Area, 1,978 acres; rateable value, £2,036; population in 1921, 222. Letters arrive twice daily through Swindon, and are despatched at 7.15 a.m. and 5.5 p.m.. Kempford is the nearest Telegraph Office, and Hannington the nearest Railway Station.

LUSHILL is 1 mile south east; letters received from Highworth.

BLACKFORD is 1 mile east.

RECTOR – Rev. C. M. R. Luckman.

SCHOOLMISTRESS – Miss Long.

CARRIERS – P. Hooper, to Cirencester on Mondays and Fridays, and to Swindon on Saturdays.
