Chicklade

Chicklade is a village and parish, in the Southern division of the county, Dunworth hundred, Tisbury union, Shaftesbury county court district, Hindon petty sessional division, Salisbury diocese and archdeaconry, and Chalke rural deanery second portion, 16 miles west from Salisbury, and 6 ½ north-east from Shaftesbury.

The church of All Saints was rebuilt of stone in a plain style, in 1834; it has a chancel and nave, a low square tower with 1 bell and will seat 174 persons. The register dates from 1721. The living is a rectory, yearly value £205, with residence, in the gift of the Marquis of Bath, and held by the Rev. Charles William Tayler, B.A., of Christ Church, Oxford.

Alfred Morrison esq. J. P. who is lord of the manor, Alfred Seymour esq. J. P. and Sir Michel Robert Shaw-Stewart, bart, are the principal landowners.

The soil is chalky; subsoil, chalk and flint. The area is 1,039 acres, mostly arable land; rateable value, £1,242..

The population, in 1871, was 122.

There is an infant school, supported by voluntary contributions. The elder children attend Hindon National school.
