

Chicklade is a village and parish, 6 miles north-west from Tisbury station on the Salisbury and Yeovil branch of the Southern railway,16 miles west from Salisbury, and 10 ½ north-east from Shaftesbury, in the Salisbury division of the county, Dunworth hundred, Tisbury and Mere petty sessional division, union of Tisbury, county court district of Shaftesbury, rural deanery of Chalke (Tisbury Portion), archdeaconry of Sarum and diocese of Salisbury.

The church of All Saints, rebuilt in 1832, is of stone and consists of chancel, nave and a low square western turret, containing one bell; the church was restored in 1894 by Mrs Alfred Morrison, and will seat 70 persons. The register dates from the year 1721. The living is a rectory, united in 1922 by an Order in Council to the vicarage of Hindon, the rectory of Pertwood being constituted a Chapel of Ease to the rectory of Chicklade, joint net yearly value £480, in the gift of the Lord Chancellor and the Marquess of Bath K.G., P.C., C.B., alternately, and held since 1922 by the Rev. Marshall Winder Lumsden L.Th. of Hatfield Hall, Durham, and hon. C.F., who resides at Hindon.

Hugh Morrison esq. M.P., D.L., J.P., who is lord of the manor, and R. Halliday esq. are the principal landowners.

The soil is chalky; subsoil, chalk and flint. The area is 1,085 acres, mostly arable land; rateable value, £867; the population in 1921 was 56.
