

Kelly's Directory Extract 1939 Chicklade



Chicklade is a village and parish, 6 miles north west from Tisbury station on the Salisbury and Yeovil branch of the Southern railway,16 miles west from Salisbury, and 10 ½ north-east from Shaftesbury, in the Salisbury division of the county, Dunworth hundred, Tisbury and Mere petty sessional division, rural district of Mere and Tisbury, county court district of Shaftesbury, rural deanery of Chalke (Tisbury Portion), archdeaconry of Sarum and diocese of Salisbury. Electricity is available.

The church of All Saints, rebuilt in 1832, is of stone and consists of chancel, nave and a low square western turret, containing one bell; the church was restored in 1894 by Mrs Alfred Morrison, and will seat 70 persons. The register dates from the year 1721. The living is a rectory, united in 1922 by an Order in Council to the vicarage of Hindon, the rectory of Pertwood being constituted a Chapel of Ease to the rectory of Chicklade, joint net yearly value £509, in the gift of the Lord Chancellor and the Viscount Weymouth alternately, and held since 1938 by the Rev. Charles Francis Wellesley Wilkinson M.A. of Queens' College, Cambridge, R.N. who resides at Hindon.

J. G. Morrison esq. J.P., M.F.H., lord of the manor, and the Duke of Somerset D.S.O., O.B.E., D.L., J.P., is the principal landowner.

The soil is chalky; subsoil, chalk and flint. The area is 958 acres, mostly arable land; the population in 1931 was 62.
