## 1870

Mr Gattrell of Chicklade, Wilts was thrown out of a trap in which he was riding on Friday evening, in consequence of one of the wheels coming into contact with a post near the National Provincial Bank. His head was severely cut, and he was otherwise injured. He was removed to the Star Inn and remained there under the care of Mr Bennett several days.

## 1874

A sad accident happened at Chicklade on Friday November 20th to Walter, son of Mr Charles Blandford, painter and glazier of Hindon. He was driving a pony can cart from Chicklade to Berwick laden with bags of dust. One of the bags fell off, causing the pony to take flight. The lad was thrown out, and one of the wheels passed over his left leg, breaking it. He was at once placed under the care of Dr Young of Hindon, who set the limb.
