Chicklade



Chicklade is a township, village and parish, 16 miles west of Salisbury, and 1 mile north of Hindon, in Dunworth Hundred, Hindon union, Salisbury bishopric and archdeaconry, and Chalke deanery, South Wilts.

The living is a rectory, with residence, value £205, in the gift of the Marquis of Bath; the incumbent is the Rev. John Cooke Faber, B.A.,

The church of All Saints has been rebuilt in a plain style, without a chancel, and will seat 174 persons; it has a tower with 1 bell. The register dates from 1721.

There is a school, chiefly supported by the rector..

The population, in 1851, was 122.

The parish contains 1,039 acres, mostly arable land.

John Candy, Esq., is lord of the manor.
