

Ríght of Way Obstructed

Mr L. L. Hinder of Pembroke Park, Salisbury, wrote complaining that a right-of-way near Blake Barn between Teffont Down and Chicklade Bottom had been obstructed by hurdles staked into the ground, completely obstructing free passage.

The Chairman said he would inspect the path and report at the next meeting. Some years ago the Council said they would raise no objection if gates were put up, and they had an agreement with Mr Morrison to remove them if he were called upon to do so. If there was a hurdle obstruction it might be advisable to leave it to him (the Chairman) to tell the Clerk who could then write to the person obstructing.

The Chairman: I should think so.

The Chairman's suggestion was agreed to.
