



Death Of Mr. A. C. Dann

Deputy Mayor of Chippenham

Chippenham's Deputy Mayor (Mr. Alfred Charles Dann), solicitor, of 46, Malmesbury Road, was found dead in bed on Monday morning.

Mr. Dann, who was 71, had attended a civic service at St. Paul's on Sunday morning, when he appeared in his usual health. On Monday a neighbour, Mr. Harry Cook, noticed that Mr. Dann, who lived alone, was not about as usual, and he went to Mr. Dann's office and informed his son, Mr. Sidney Dann, of the fact.

Together they went to the house, and, on Mr. Sidney Dann going upstairs, the discovery was made.

Mr. Dann was a native of Bath and had practised in Chippenham for 35 years. He joined Chippenham Town Council in 1933 and was elected Mayor in November, 1938.

For many years Mr. Dann was associated with St. Paul's Church, where he was a warden and a member of the Parochial Church Council.

A Freemason, he was Worshipful Master of the Chippenham Lodge in 1925. He had been president, secretary and a member of the committee of the Chippenham Literary Institute and in his younger days he was a keen cricketer and cyclist.

He was a member of the Chippenham Park Bowling Club.

Mrs. Dann died in 1934. There are two sons, Mr. Charles Dann being in Kenya.
