1838

Died. February 9, at Chippenham, aged 76, Mr. William Brobbins, formerly of Jamaica. **Wiltshire Independent, Thursday, 22 February 1838, Page 2, Column 7**

May 12, at Chippenham, Mr. Conway, aged 72. For the greater part of his life he was in the service of Lady Dalrymple, by whose family he was much respected. **Wiltshire Independent, 17 May 1838**

1843

Died, January 30, at the Angel Inn, Chippenham, aged 50, after a long illness, sincerely regretted by his family and friends, Mr. Joseph Lawes. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 4 February 1843**

1846

March 18, at Chippenham, the lady of R. D. Little, esq. a daughter. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 19 March 1846**

Married, December 14, at St Augustine's church, Bristol, by the Rev. W. Milner, Henry, youngest son of Mr. William. Gale, ironmonger, to Louisa, daughter of Mr. Joseph Moore, of the Duke Inn, Chippenham. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 19 December 1846**
