A handcuffed Prisoner

Before the ex-mayor on Saturday, a young man named Albert Crofts, was charged with obtaining £4 by means of a worthless cheque from Mr. Moorhouse, of the Talbot Hotel, Chippenham. The prisoner appeared in Court wearing handcuffs. Superintendent Wells, in opposing bail, said that when prisoner was arrested at Bath, he escaped, and had to be re-captured. He was wearing handcuffs because they could not trust him. Prisoner was offered bail of £400, but was remanded in custody until Friday.
