

Post Office Directory Extract 1875 Chippenham



Chippenham is a parliamentary and municipal borough, market and union town and head of a county court district, and station on the Great Western railway, from which the branch to Calne starts from this town. It is a polling place for the Northern division of the county, in the hundred of Chippenham, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, and rural deanery of Malmesbury south, 93¾ miles from London, 13 north-east from Bath, 33 north-west from Salisbury, 10 north-west from Devizes, 10 south from Malmesbury, 7 north from Melksham, 6 north-west from Calne, situated on the river Avon and connected by a short branch with the Wilts and Berks canal.

Chippenham is an ancient borough, and was incorporated in 1554. Under the Municipal Corporation Act, the government is vested in a mayor, four aldermen, and twelve councillors. It returned two members to Parliament, but under the "Representation of the People Act 1867," it now sends one only. The Parliamentary borough includes the entire parish, as well as the adjoining parishes of Langley Burrell, Hardenhuish, Pewsham, Tytherton Lucas and Tytherton Kellaways. The houses are well built, and the principal street is more than half a mile long.

The parish church of St Andrew is an ancient structure, in the Norman, Early Decorated and Perpendicular English styles. It contains a very curious chapel, with memorials to the Hungerfords, a monument of 1627 to Sir Gilbert Prynne, and several ancient memorials in the chancel and its adjoining chapel. It has also a chapel dedicated to St Catherine. The tower is of Late Perpendicular, with a spire, 8 bells, and an illuminated clock with chimes. The register dates from 1578. The living is a discharged vicarage, to which the rectory of Tytherton Lucas is annexed, joint yearly value £320, with residence, in the gift of Christ Church, Oxford, and held by the Rev. John Rich, M.A., late student of that house.

St Paul's is a separate ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1855, out of Chippenham, Hardenhuish, Kington St Michael, and Langley Hurrell parishes. The church of St Paul was erected in 1855, near the railway station. It is a handsome stone building in the style of the 14th century, and consists of a chancel, nave with celerestory and aisles, a tower with spire, clock with chimes every quarter, and 8 bells. The living is a rectory, yearly value £200, in the gift of the Bishop of Gloucester and Bristol, and held by the Rev. Augustus Strong, M.A., of Exeter College, Oxford.

A Free school for 12 boys, sons of freemen, was endowed in the year 1664, but has been discontinued. There are National and British schools for children of the poor.

There are places of worship for Baptists (three), Primitive Methodists (two), Independents, Wesleyans, and Roman Catholics.

The charities for distribution are of £125 yearly value. On the Bristol road are six residences, erected by Charles Bailey, esq., of this town, for aged and infirm medical men or their widows, to be elected by trustees.

The Town Hall, covered Market-yard, Exchange-room and buildings, situated in High street, were erected for the accommodation of the town and neighbourhood, at a cost of about £12,000, at the sole expense of the late Joseph Neeld, esq., of Grittleton, who was for many years member for the borough of Chippenham. The hall is 50 feet in length, 33 in width, 19 in height, with spacious ante-rooms, and is surmounted by the arms of the donor. The cheese market has a freestone frontage in the High street, surmounted by the old borough arms in carved stone, beneath which is the borough motto, "Unity and Loyalty." It was extended three times during the life of the same gentleman, at a further cost to him of from £4,000 to £5,000.

The market is now held on the second Friday in every month for cheese and cattle, and the fourth Friday for cattle. There are two annual hiring fairs and an annual cattle show.

The principal manufactures are broadcloth and silk, and here is an extensive tannery.

The Temperance Hall is a handsome freestone structure, comprising a lecture hall, to accommodate 500 persons, workmen's reading and coffee rooms, lavatory, refreshment room, and a residence for the hall keeper. It occupies the site of an old public house and malt-house, known as the "White Hart", and was erected in 1863, under the superintendence of W J Street, esq., of Warminster, architect, at a cost of £1,384 6s 4d, which sum was collected by Messrs Thomas Mills & Son, president and secretary of the Chippenham Temperance Society.

A causeway, 4½ miles in length, from Chippenham Cliff to Wickhill, Bremhill (extending though the parishes of Langley Burrell, Kellaways and Tytherton), was constructed by Maud Heath in the year 1474 (in the reign of King Edward IV), who gave to certain trustees some houses and land in and near Chippenham to keep the same in repair. She is said by common report to have been a market woman who, having long felt the inconvenience of a swampy walk, devoted the savings of her life to the purpose of providing a good footing for her successors in all time to come. The trustees have extended and renewed the same from their surplus fund, and some years since erected an iron bridge across the Avon at Kellaways, where a raised path , upon 64 arches, exists for the convenience of travellers, and enables them in times of flood, which are frequent in this neighbourhood, to pass the stream in safety. The causeway is marked with upright inscribed stones at intervals, and a monument to the donor has been erected in Wickhill.

Here is a literary and scientific institution.

Lodowick Muggleton, founder of the sect, Muggletonians, was a native of this parish. Dr Thomas Scott, the celebrated divine, was born here, October 1638.

The area of this parish is 6,981 acres; gross estimated rental, £30,691 10s; rateable value, £24,007 17s. The population of the parish in 1871 was 5,202. The municipal borough only contained 1,387, and the Parliamentary borough, 6,875.

Allington is a hamlet, now forming part of the parish of St Paul, 2 miles north-west from Chippenham.

Nethermore, Stanley and Studley are tithings.

The ecclesiastically parish of **Derryhill** extends over a portion of the parish of Chippenham.
