PHOTO OF MASTER AND MEN 8,000 MILES FROM WORKS

The photograph which we produce in this week's issue has been forwarded by Col.-Sergt. T. H. Howe, from Kingsway Camp, Delhi, with the following report.

The Chippenham Company ("D") of the 4th Wilts Regiment stationed at the Fort, Delhi, were agreeably Surprised to receive a visit from Mr. P. F. Hodgson, Managing Director of Saxby & Farmer, Ltd., Chippenham, On January 6th 1915. Among the Company are numerous employees of Mr. Hodgson's firm, and it was at once decided to have a photograph of the Company taken with him.

Unfortunately, owing to duties having to be done at different places, a good many were unable to be present, and doubtless friends at home will notice a good many are absent, but I must say it is only duty that kept them away, and at this time we put duty before anything. We should have liked very much to have had everyone of the Chippenham men present, as it is a unique photograph of master and men 8,000 miles from the works.

Mr. Hodgson wished all his men a safe return home at an early date, and hoped to meet them all again Settled down in the works at Chippenham.
