

Post Office Directory Extract 1855 Chitterne



CHITTERNE ALL SAINTS, or Chiltern, a township and parish in the Hundred of Heytesbury, and Warminster Union, South Wilts, distant 8 miles east from Warminster, and 4 north-east from Heytesbury. The living is a vicarage, united to that of Chitterne St. Mary, in the archdeaconry and diocese of Salisbury, value £319, and in the patronage of the Bishop and Dean and Chapter of Salisbury, alternately. The Rev. William Macdonald, M.A., Archdeacon of Wilts, is the incumbent. Here is a small public school. Population, in 1851, 452; acreage, 4,411; rateable value, £2,419.

CHITTERNE ST. MARY is an adjoining parish, in the same Hundred and Union. The living is also a vicarage, and united as above. Population, in 1851, 239; area in acres, 1,198; rateable value, £1,000. On the downs are barrows.
