Codford St. Mary

In the month of June last, the south wall of the parish church of Codford Saint Mary, in this county, suddenly fell down, the church being an ancient structure, and in a very dilapidated state. Subscriptions are in progress to repair the calamity, and Divine Service is now performed in the school-room, which has been fitted up for the purpose.

SALISBURY DIOCESAN CHURCH BUILDING ASSOCIATION

The Triennial Meeting of the Salisbury Diocesan Church Building Association, was held on Wednesday last, in the County Hall, Dorchester, there being a numerous and highly respectable attendance: indeed, we have seldom seen a more influential meeting assembled.

......The south wall of the Church at Codford St. Mary, having fallen down from decay, the parish was about to restore it; but as a favourable opportunity thus presented itself of enlarging the fabric, and thereby affording additional accommodation which an increased population had long required, it was determined to erect a new aisle, thereby offering free seats to 81 persons, towards which your Committee have veted a grant of £60.

The parish church of Codford Saint Mary, in this county, now rebuilding, with the exception of the tower and part of the chancel, is rapidly approaching towards completion, and will be shortly re-opened for divine service
