Henwood	Henry	Along with Job Show (or Snow), charged with stealing three ducks and one fowl, belonging to Rev. H. Wightwick.  2 months hard labour	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 12 <sup>th</sup> May, 1866
Show/Snow	Job	Along with Henry Henwood, charged with stealing three ducks and one fowl, belonging to Rev. H. Wightwick.  Discharged as case was not proved against him	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 12 <sup>th</sup> May, 1866
Bennett	Thomas	Labourer, indicted for feloniously stealing a quantity of slabs of wood, value 8s., the property of John Frederick Everett, of Codford St. Peter.  6 months, hard labour	<i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 4 <sup>th</sup> July, 1868
Williams	Eliza	An aged tramp, having feloniously stolen a brush and duster, the property of the Hon. W. L. Holmes a'Court, at Codford.  Pled guilty – 3 month's hard labour	<i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 6 <sup>th</sup> July, 1871
Batt	William	Charged with stealing a silver watch chain, value 7s.  1 month hard labour	<i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 10 <sup>th</sup> May, 1883
