John Bodley Kelland was born 4th June, 1895 at Otakeho, New Zealand, the son of George Thomas Bodley & Mary Kelland (nee Hayes). He was a 21 year old, single, Carrier from Taumarunui, New Zealand when he enlisted on 24th July, 1916 with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force. His service number was 31294 & his religion was Roman Catholic. His next of kin was listed as his mother – Mrs Mary Bowers (George Thomas Bodley Kelland had died in 1902 & Mary Kelland had remarried in 1908 to Albert Bowers) of Taumarunui, New Zealand.

While training still in New Zealand with the 19th Reinforcements, B Company of Wellington Infantry Battalion, Private John Bodley Kelland was given 3 days Confined to Barracks on 17th September, 1916 for being absent from Church Parade. He was again Confined to Barracks plus forfeited 2 days pay for overstaying leave from 3rd November, 1916 to 5th November, 1916.

Private John Bodley Kelland embarked with 19th Reinforcements, Wellington Infantry Battalion, B Company from Wellington, New Zealand on HMNZT (69) *Tahiti* on 15th November, 1916, destination England. Pte Kelland was admitted to Ship's Hospital on 8th December, 1916 until 25th December, 1916 with Measles. He disembarked at Devonport, England on 29th January, 1917.

Pte Kelland was marched in to Sling Army Camp, Wiltshire on 29th January, 1917.

Pte Kelland was admitted to No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital on 8th February, 1917 with pneumonia. He was reported seriously ill on 9th February, 1917.

Private John Bodley Kelland died on 11th February, 1917 at No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire of Lobar Pneumonia.

A death for John B. Kelland, aged 21, was registered in the March quarter, 1917 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

Private John Bodley Kelland was buried at St. Mary's Cemetery, Codford on 14th February, 1917.

Private John Bodley Kelland, 31294 was last attached to 19th Reinforcements, Wellington Regiment.

Private John Bodley Kelland was entitled to British War Medal only as he had not entered a Theatre of War. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to – It is unclear who received Pte Kelland's Medals as 2 names appear on different forms – Mrs Gladys H. McKay (sister) of Post Office Taumaranui apparently received his medals & Mr Walter Kelland (brother) of West Taupo was recorded as receiving the Scroll & Plaque however T. Kelland signed as having received the Memorial Scroll & Plaque (June, 1921 & February, 1922)
