John George Saville was born on 27<sup>th</sup> December, 1887 in England. He was a 29 year old, single, Ploughman from Timaru, New Zealand when he enlisted on 5<sup>th</sup> May, 1917 with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force. His service number was 73523 & his religion was Church of England. From the details on his Attestation Papers, John Saville did not know the names of his parents as he had been adopted. He did know that both his parents had been born in England. John Saville had been resident in New Zealand for 5 years when he enlisted in May, 1917.

John George Saville married Hannah Jane Wills on 27<sup>th</sup> May, 1918 at Timaru, New Zealand.

Private John George Saville embarked with New Zealand Expeditionary Force. 40<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements, E Company from Wellington, New Zealand on HMNZT (107) *Tahiti* on 10<sup>th</sup> July, 1918, destination England. He disembarked at London, England on 9<sup>th</sup> September, 1918.

Pte Saville was admitted to No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital, Codford, Wiltshire on 11<sup>th</sup> September, 1918. He was reported as Dangerously III on 12<sup>th</sup> September, 1918 with acute bronchitis.

Private John George Saville died on 15<sup>th</sup> September, 1918 at No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire of Purulent Bronchitis.

A death for John G. Saville, aged 31, was registered in the September quarter, 1918 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

Private John George Saville was buried at St. Mary's Cemetery, Codford on 17<sup>th</sup> September, 1918.

Private John George Saville, 73523 was last attached to New Zealand Infantry – 40<sup>th</sup> Reinforcements.

Private John George Saville was entitled to British War Medal only as he had not entered a Theatre of War. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Pte Saville's wife – Mrs H. J. Saville c/o Mr D Willis 13 Craighead St, Timaru (June, 1921 & December, 1921)

Details obtained on Commonwealth War Graves Commission (CWGC) show that Pte John George Saville was the son of Frank & Sarah Saville & he was born in Durham, England.
