Michael Sexton was born on 1st April, 1889 at Westport, New Zealand, the son of William & Bridget Sexton (nee Doody). Both his parents were born in Ireland.

Michael Sexton was a 28 year old, single, Night Porter at Provincial Hotel in Dunedin, New Zealand when he enlisted on 21st June, 1917 with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force. His service number was 65462 & his religion was Roman Catholic. His next of kin was listed as his mother – Mrs Bridget Sexton of Upper Palmerston Street, Westport, New Zealand.

Rifleman Michael Sexton embarked with 33rd Reinforcements, Canterbury Infantry Regiment, C Company from Wellington, New Zealand on HMNZT (99) *Athenic* on 31st December, 1917. He disembarked at Glasgow, Scotland on 25th February, 1918.

Rifleman Michael Sexton was marched in to Larkhill Army Camp, Wiltshire, England with Canterbury Coy., on 26th February, 1918.

Rifleman Michael Sexton was admitted to V.D. Section of No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire on 29th April, 1918. He was discharged & attached to V.D. Convalescent section on 25th June, 1918 & then discharged to Command Depot at Codford on 3rd July, 1918.

Rifleman Michael Sexton was marched in the New Zealand Reserve Brigade at Brocton, Staffordshire on 1st August, 1918. He was readmitted to V.D. Section of No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford on 12th September, 1918 & attached to V.D. Convalescent section on 8th February, 1919. He was reported on the seriously ill list on 15th February, 1919 & then transferred to dangerously ill list on 17th February, 1919.

Rifleman Michael Sexton died on 18th February, 1919 at No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital at Codford, Wiltshire of Pneumonia.

A death for Michael Sexton, aged 19, was registered in the March quarter, 1919 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

Rifleman Michael Sexton was buried at St. Mary's New Cemetery, Codford on 21st or 22nd February, 1919.

Rifleman Michael Sexton, 65462, was last attached to New Zealand Rifle Brigade (Reserve). He had served in the

Rifleman Michael Sexton was entitled to British War Medal only as he had not entered a Theatre of War. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Mr C. Sexton of Greymouth (Bridget Sexton -mother deceased 1921) (March, 1921 & November, 1921).

The CWGC lists Rifleman Michael Sexton, 65462, of New Zealand Rifle Brigade as the son of William and Bridget Sexton, of Westport.
