Penalty - Fine Incurred for Crimes Committed

The following offenders were given a fine in lieu of prison for their criminal offences.

| Surname | Given Names | Crime | Newspaper report |

| Mold | Joseph | Baker of Codford St. Mary, along with 4 other bakers, were convicted in mitigated penalties for having short weights and using alum and other ingredients in their bread prohibited by Act of Parliament. Fined 5 l. each | <i>Salisbury and Winchester Journal</i> 11 th December, 1826 |
| Carter | Isaac | Labourer, of Codford, charged with drunkenness at Codford on 27 th September. He pleaded guilty. Fined 5s. and costs (which he paid) | <i>Wiltshire Independent</i> 8 th October, 1874 |
| Line | William Henry | A gardener, of Codford, charged with unlawfully and maliciously destroying plants & vegetables belonging to Mr T. K. Harding of Ashton House, Codford. Fined £5, including costs (defendant paid the money) | <i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 30 th September, 1886 |
| Brown | James | Of Codford, was sued by James Grierson, of Salisbury, for £2 4s. the balance due for a suit of clothes supplied to him by the plaintiff. Judgement for the plaintiff for £2 | <i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 4 th October, 1888 |
| Wakeley | James | Of Codford, for using a gun without a license. Fined 16 s. | <i>Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette</i> 8 th November, 1888 |
