



R.A.F Pilot and Passenger Killed



Pilot Officer Roy Francis See, 22, and Aircraftman Harold George Gray, both of No. 13 (Army Cooperation) Squadron, R.A.F., Old Sarum, were killed when their aeroplane crashed during camera-gun practice near Codford, Wiltshire, yesterday. Pilot Officer See came from London and Aircraftman Gray's home was in Dorset.

Two Dead in R.A.F. Crash

Two R.A.F. men – a pilot and his passenger – were killed in a crash near Codford, Wiltshire, yesterday during camera-gun practice.

An official communiqué stated :- “The Air Ministry regrets to announce that Pilot Officer Roy Francis See and Aircraftman (First Class) Harold George Gray lost their lives in an accident which occurred near Codford, Wiltshire, yesterday to an aircraft of No. 15 Army Co-operation Squadron, Old Sarum.” It is understood that See was a London man and that Gray's home was in Dorsetshire.

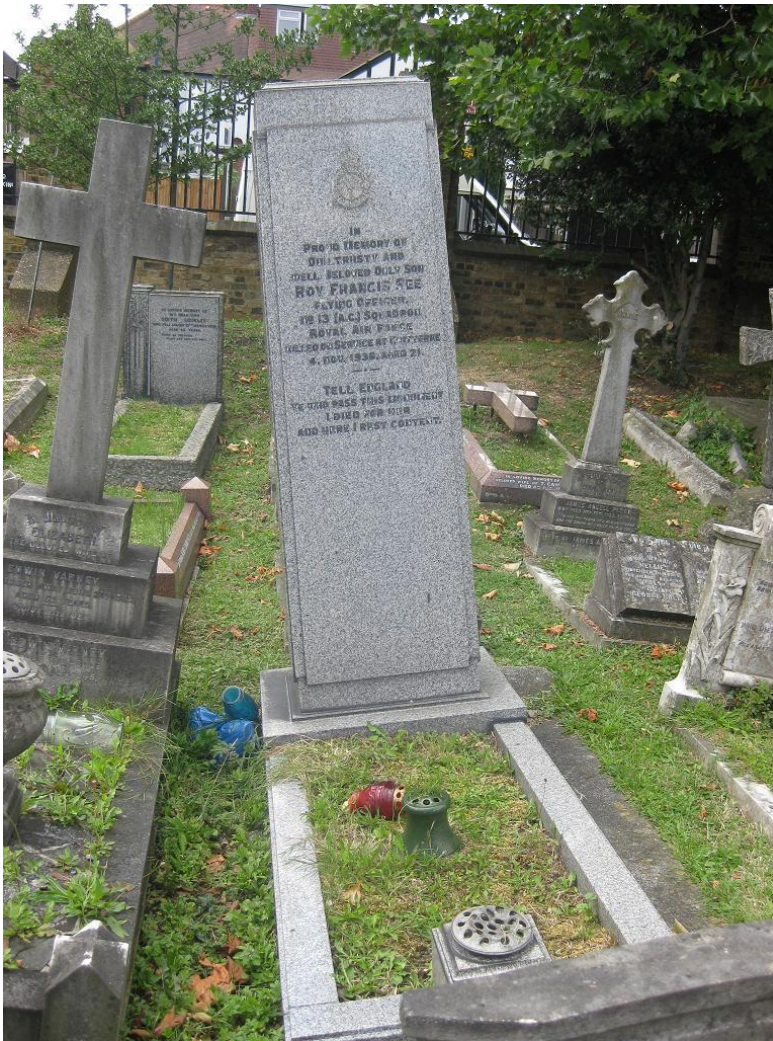
Air Crash at Chitterne...



70 years ago this month on 4th November 1936 an aeroplane crashed on the outskirts of Chitterne and two airmen were killed. P/O Roy Francis See and AC1 Harold George Gray were flying the Hawker Audax from 13 Squadron based at Old Sarum on camera gun practice, when they crashed avoiding a windmill. The windmill was a 'Woodcock' Windpump, made by the John Wallis Titt company and installed in 1905 on Charlie Collins' Manor Farm land to the left of the road to Tilshead. Several village children were told off for going to see the crash site when they should have been at school!
