

Codford St. Peter's Church

Oct.14, at Codford St. Peter, Wilts, in the 76th year of his age, much respected and lamented, the Rev. John Dampier, M.A., many years the Rector of that Parish, and of Langton Matravers, in the county of Dorset.

On the 22nd instant, the Rev. Henry Wightwick, M.A., was instituted by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese to the Rectory of Codford St. Peter, Wilts (400 ℓ a year), void by the cession of the Rev. Charles Wightwick, on the Presentation of the Master, Fellows, and Scholars of Pembroke College, Oxford.

Canon Edward Denny, M.A. (Pembroke College, Oxford), rector of Codford St. Peter, Wilts, since 1915, died on Friday at Codford. He was the author of "Papalism" and joint author with Canon Lacey of "de Hierachia Anglicana." He was a prominent member of the Anglo-Catholic Party. He leaves a widow, four sons, and six daughters.
