A Medical	A Medical Board was convened on 17th January 1919 and Alexander's case was reviewed. The Board found that his Bronchial Asthma was aggravated by stress and infection										
during Active Service. The Board recommended that he be discharged to New Zealand as unfit for Active Service.											
Records show that Private Alexander John Griffin died at 3.30 a.m. on 22nd January 1919 of Heart Failure and Bronchial Asthma at No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital,											
Codford, Wiltshire.											
He was buried at St. Mary New Cemetery, Codford on 25th January 1919											
Alexander was entitled to British War Medal only as he had not entered a Theatre of War. A Memorial Scroll and Memorial Plaque were sent to private Griffin's widow in June											
1921 and November 1922 respectively. The address recorded for Ethel Griffin was Bonny Glen, Marton, Wanghanui, New Zealand.
