Commonwealth War Graves Headstone for Rifleman W. Garlick is located in Second Row (Left Hand Side) Grave Plot # 44 of Codford War Graves Cemetery (Using Map by Brian Marshall) (CWGC Reference - Grave # 28) William Garlick's birth was registered in 1888 as William Tapsell. He was born on 10th October, 1888 at Opotiki, New Zealand. His mother was Maria Dorothy Tapsell & his father's name was not recorded at the time of his birth. Maria Doroth<u>ea</u> Tapsell later married Charles Garlick in 1890.

William Garlick was a 28 year old, single, and a Farmer from Taikape, New Zealand when he enlisted with the New Zealand Expeditionary Force on 22nd March, 1916. His service number was 17708 & his religion was Anglican. His next of kin was listed as his sister – Miss Mary Garlick of Whakatane, Bay of Plenty, New Zealand.

Rifleman William Garlick embarked with 11th Reinforcements, 2nd Battalion, F Company from Wellington, New Zealand on HMNZT (64) *Devon* on 25th September, 1916. He disembarked at Devonport, England on 21st November, 1916.

Rifleman William Garlick was marched in to Sling Army Camp, Wiltshire on 21st November, 1916.

Rifleman William Garlick was admitted to No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital, Codford, Wiltshire on 6th December, 1916 with Pleurisy (slight) & reported as dangerously ill on 9th December, 1916.

Rifleman William Garlick died on 13th December, 1916 in No. 3 New Zealand General Hospital Codford, Wiltshire at the age of 29 years of Pneumonia.

A death for William Garlick, aged 29, was registered in the December quarter, 1916 in the district of Warminster, Wiltshire, England.

Rifleman William Garlick was buried at St. Mary's New Cemetery, Codford on 16th December, 1916.

Rifleman William Garlick, 17708 was last attached to New Zealand Rifle Brigade (Reserve).

Rifleman William Garlick was entitled to British War Medal only as he had not entered a Theatre of War. A Memorial Scroll & Memorial Plaque were also sent to Mr Charles Garlick of Taneatua, Bay of Plenty – (June, 1921 & Feb, 1922).

The CWGC lists Rifleman William Garlick as the son of Charles and Maria Dorothy Garlick of Taneatua, Bay of Plenty.
