## Fire at Colerne - 1st April 1774

The fire raged down one side of the High Street setting alight building after building. In all 42 houses, 2 malt houses, 18 barns, 7 stables, 36 outhouses, 3 wheat ricks and 3 hayricks were 'reduced to ashes'. Sixty three families lost their homes and there were calls for immediate relief.

People were asked to leave their donations at the following places: "The Bath Bank", "Public Rooms", "Pump Room", coffee houses or booksellers in Bath.

The final amount would be distributed by the Right Hon. The Earl of Denbigh, The Right Hon. Lord Viscount Palmerston, Archdeacon Chapman, the Rector of Bath, the Mayor of Bath, James Clutterbuck Esq. of Lucknam House, Colerne and the Reverend Merewether, Minister of Colerne, amongst other notables.

Damages were estimated at £4246 6s. 5½d. The only house insured (at £300) was that of Thomas Southward

Churches often included 'briefs' in their sermons, asking for donations for help with the church roof, but also for events such as this.

It is very much apparent by the contrast of buildings and period styles that there was much rebuilding carried out within the village.
