

Post Office Directory Extract 1875 Colerne



Colerne is a parish and village in the Northern division of the county, hundred, union and county court district of Chippenham, diocese of Gloucester and Bristol, archdeaconry of Bristol, and rural deanery of Malmesbury South, 8¾ miles west-south-west from Chippenham, 2 north-west from Box railway station, 104 from London, and 6½ north-east from Bath.

The church of St John the Baptist is an ancient structure, consisting of a chancel, nave and aisles, with a tower containing 6 bells. The style of architecture is principally Gothic, but partly late Norman. The register dates from the latter part of the sixteenth century. The living is a sinecure rectory and vicarage. The rectory, value about £400, is annexed to the Wardenship of New College, Oxford, and is now held by the Rev. James Edward Sewell, D.D., warden. The vicarage is of the yearly value of £90, with residence, in the gift of the rector, and held by the Rev. Augustus Turner, B.A., of Sidney Sussex College, Cambridge.

Here is a National school for boys and girls, erected in 1853; also Independent and Baptist chapels.

There are charities of the annual value of about £16, given to the deserving poor at the discretion of the vicar and churchwardens. Also 25 acres of charity land, is let in allotments, at 2s 3d per half acre, free of poor's rates and land tax, to the poor of the parish, of which the vicars of Colerne, Marshfield and Box are trustees.

Lucknam House is the seat of Richard Walmesley, esq., J.P., who is lord of the manor of Euridge. The Warden and Scholars of New College, Oxford, are lords of the manor of Colerne.

The soil is various. The chief crops are wheat, barley and roots.

The parish contains 3,855 acres; gross estimated rental, £6,545 7s; rateable value, £5,735 2s; in 1871 the population was 1,096.

Euridge consists of a farm-house and two cottages.
