

Colerne Buildings and Land 1810

Farms in Wiltshire

To be LETT, for a term of 8 years, from
Lady-Day 1811, the two following FARMS:-
LUCKENHAM FARM, in the occupation of Mr.
Robert Brokenbrow; comprising a good farm-house,
and proper out-buildings, and about 258 acres of arable
and about 38 acres of meadow and pasture land.
EWRIDGE FARM, in occupation of Mr.
William Brokenbrow; comprising a good roomy
farm-house, and spacious suitable out-buildings, with
about 233 acres of arable, and about 124 acres of
pasture land.

The above farms are advantageously situate in the
parish of Colerne, at the distance of 8 miles from
Bath and Chippenham. The lands are adapted for
Stock Farms, being in high condition, well watered,
and the soil suited to the modern systems of improved
husbandry.

On the inclosure of Colerne, about 1787, the tythes
were commuted for a corn tent, which, from
the very rapid improvements that have since taken
place, is now become exceedingly moderate. The poor-
rates are about two shillings in the pound.
