**William Harris D:D.** Gave to the Poor  
of the Parifh of Cullern in manner & form following  
ITEM I will & require my Executors to lay out three hundred Pounds in one Parcell of  
Land which I defire may be conveyed to fuch perfons as they fhall think fit in truft that  
the Rents Ifues & pronts thereof be Difpofed Yearly & every Year amongft fuch Poor  
perfons of Cullern where I was born which are Houfekeepers & take no Almes of the  
Parifh to be diftributed at the Feaft of EASTER & CHRISTMAS by the difcretion of my  
Executors the Vicar Churchwardens & Overfeers of the Poor there But if it Fhould  
happen that my Executors Dye without Ifsue Then he that is the Owner or Right  
Proprietor of the FARM in Cullern Hall fhall be a Truftee with the Vicar there to fee  
this Charitable ufe honefyly difpofed of to fuch Poor People as realy want the fame.

**MEMORANDUM** that **CHARLES SAVAGE** of Weftwood in the County Esqr. Being  
one of Dr. HARRIS'S Executors Has in Lein of the faid three hundred Pounds fetled a  
rent Charge of twelve Pounds Per Annum free from all taxes & payments whatsoever  
For the payment of which ye faid CHARLES SAVAGE Has charged an Eaftate of his  
at Keevil wick in the Parifh of Keevil in the County of Wilts.

This Monument was Erected in the Year 1708  
To the Memory of that Pious Devive D. WILLIAM  
HARRIS. Who died Novem: the 9. 1700 & was Interred  
in the Cathedral Church at Winchefter

Beneath this Place Lyes Interred the Body of  
THMAS HARRIS Esqr. Late of this Prfh Elder,  
Brother to the faid D. HARRIS Who Departed this  
life the 19<sup>th</sup> of March Anno Domini 1691
