Collingbourne Kingston 1800-1849

1815

Committed to Fisher Gaol. James Richardson and John Holmes, jnr., labourers, of Ludgershall, charged on the oath of William Morey, of Collingbourne, turner, on a violent suspicion of having robbed him on the highway. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 11 December 1815**

1827

Committed to Fisherton Gaol. Thomas Nutley, charged with stealing gold watch and several gold and other rings, the property of Thomas and Anne Gilbert, at Collingbourne Kingston. **Devizes & Wiltshire Gazette, 4 January 1827; Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 8 January 1827; Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 11 January 1827**

Removed from Fisherton Gaol. On Saturday the following were removed on board the Captivity hulk, Devonport: ...Thomas Nutley,... Transported for life. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 28 May 1827** [OPC Note: Thomas Nutley was transported to Australia]

1833

Committed to the House of Correction, Devizes. John Evans, for one month, for assaulting Thomas Mist, of Collingbourne Kingston. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 10 June 1833**

1834

Committed to the House of Correction, Devizes. Thomas Smart for two months, for assaulting Robert Astley, gamekeeper in the parish Collingbourne Kingston. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 27 November 1834**

1835

Committed to the House of Correction, Devizes. Henry Walker, of Collingbourne Kingston, for one month, for killing game without having a game certificate. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 3 September 1835**

Committed to House of Correction, Devizes. Isaac Carter, for one month, for vagrancy in the parish of Collingbourne. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 3 September 1835**

1836

Committed to the House of Correction, Devizes. Isaac Coster, for one month, for leaving the service of John Mills, of Collingbourne Kingston. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 6 June 1836**

1837

Committed to Bridewell, Marlborough. Henry Walker, for one month, for stealing wood, the property of William Clunes, at Collingbourne Kingston. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 27 November 1837**

1838

Committed to Bridewell, Marlborough George Fisher, for two months, for a trespass at Collingbourne Kingston **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette 15 February 1838 and Wiltshire Independent, 22 February 1838**

Aaron Lawrence was charged with stealing half a pound of bacon, the property of Henry Cox at Collingbourne Kingston. Guilty His lordship said that, taking into consideration the prisoner's age, and the time he had already been confined, he should only sentence him to seven days imprisonment **Hampshire Advertiser, 10 March 1838 and Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 12 March 1838**

1840

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes Henry Walker, for two months, for destroying game at Collingbourne Kingston **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 16 January 1840**

1841

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes Isaac Coster, wilfully damaging a wood fence, at Collingbourne Kingston **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 10 May 1841**

1842

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes Isaac Coster, 2 months, leaving his family chargeable at Collingbourne Kingston **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 3 December 1842**

1843

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes John Maldouey, for 14 days, for vagrancy at Collingbourne Kingston **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 24 August 1843**

1847

Committed to the New Prison, Devizes George Crouch, 1 month, stealing apples from the orchard of Thomas Sheppard, at Collingbourne Kingston **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, 4 September 1847**

1848

For trial. William Tozer, charged with having burglariously entered the dwelling houses of Richard Allen at Collingbourne Kingston **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, 15 June 1848**
