Collingbourne Kingston & Collingbourne Ducis

COLLINGBOURN KINGSTON, or Upper Collingbourn, is 4 miles north of Ludgershall, 11 south-east from Marlborough, and 18 south-east from Devizes, in the Hundred of Kinwardstone, and on the Bourne river - in this part only a winter stream; its church is dedicated to the Virgin. The parish includes the hamlets of Aughton, Brunton, Southdown, Kingston, and part of Cadley. The living is a vicarage, in the gift of the Dean and Chapter of Winchester; the rectorial tithe and rent charge is £1,230; the vicarial tithe and rent charge is £320. Population 922, for whom the church affords sufficient accommodation; assessed property, £6,065. Here is a Wesleyan chapel, and a school on the National system. The area of the parish is 7,200 acres.

AUGHTON, or Alton, is a tithing, half a mile north; Bunton or Brumston tithing, half a mile north-east; Southton or Sutton Vallance tithing, half a mile south. Kingston is a tithing.

Lower COLLINGBOURN, or Collingbourn Ducis, on the same river, 1 mile nearer to Ludgershall, but in the Hundred of Elstub and Everly, is a rectory with an income of £585; patron, the Marquis of Ailesbury; acreage, 3,308; population, in 1851, 536; annual assessed property, £2,843. The adjunct of Ducis is derived from having once been parcel of the Duchy of Lancaster. The late rector bequeathed the sum of £100, the interest of which to be appropriated to the repairs of the church.
