HMS Exmouth was torpedoed on 21 January 1940 by the German submarine U22 off Tarbett Ness in the Moray Firth, Scotland. It was hit at 04.44 hours, sinking with no survivors East-South-East of Wick, Scotland. The wreck lies in 40 metres of water.
