**Be it remembered** that Elizabeth Coster, widow, relict and Executrix of within named Robert Costar or Coster within named Testator, came personally before me at Collingbourne Ducis, this twenty- forth day of July 1820 and swore to the identity of Truth of the within Will of the said Robert Coster who died July the second, instant: and that the personal property of the said Robert Coster does not amount in the whole to one hundred and forty pounds sterling money: and the said Elizabeth Coster further swore to Administer to the said last will of her late husband.

**The Will of Robert Coster, deceased**

This will was proved at Collingbourne Ducis on the twenty forth Day of July 1820 before the Reverend Charles Francis Clerk, Master of Arts, Lawful surrogate of the Revd and Worshipful the Chancellor of the Diocese of Sarum,

And by him the Administration of all and singular the Goods and Chattels of the said Deceased, and any ways concerning his Will was committed unto Elizabeth Coster Widow Relict of the Deceased and the Sole Executrix therein named.

(being first duly sworn... of the truth of the said Will, and faithfully to perform the same, and to pay the Deceased's Debts and Legacies as far forth as his Goods and Chattels will thereto extend and the Law bind, and to exhibit a true and perfect Inventory of the Goods, Chattels, and Credits of the Deceased, and yield a just and true Accompt when legally required) saving the Rights of all Persons.
