Alfred was a twin his brother being William J. Lock, both registered in the December Quarter of 1890 in the Wilton Registration District.							
In the 1891 Census both brothers are listed with their grandparents Moses & Mary Ann Prolles							
In the 1901 Census both brothers and their widowed mother are listed as visitors to the Lankey family at 44 Eaton Road, Dover, Kent							
In the 1911 Census Alfred is listed as being an under-footman at the Abbey, Amesbury							
On March 11th 1913 Alfred arrived at Boston Massachusetts, USA having sailed aboard the S.S. Ascania from Southampton. His destination was North Battleford, Saskatchewan, Canada where he intended to work in farming.							
On 11th November 1915 Alfred married Isabel H. McHayward in the Bronx, New York, USA							
In 1917-1918 Alfred completed a WWI registration card, he gave his birth date as 12th October 1885. His							

occupation was a butler. He enlisted at Nassau County, New York on 9th October 1917 and was discharged on the 1st July 1919 at Upton, New York

In the 1920 US Census it states that Alfred was naturalised in 1919 and was resident with wife Isabel and their twin infant sons Alfred & Alexander, both born in New York. Their address was Girbout Avenue, Bronx, New York.

In the 1930 US Census lists Alfred as working as a butler in a hotel and resident with his wife Isabel and their three children, twins Alfred & Alexander aged 10 and daughter Isabel aged 2. They family were sharing their home with 3 boarders at West Twentieth Street, Manhattan, New York.

Alfred James Lock, Snr. Died in 1931

Alfred James Lock, Jnr. Served in the US Navy during WWII having enlisted in 1943, his attestation lists his mother Isabel as next of kin

In 1946 Alfred James and Isabel Lock were listed as resident at 261 Emerson Street, South Boston, Massachusetts, USA in the Boston, Massachusetts City Directory. This is probably Alfred James, Jnr.

Alfred James Lock, Jnr. Died 17th November 1963 and buried on the 22nd November 1963 in New York.

In some of the documentation Alfred gives his date of birth as 12th October 1887. The reason for this is not known.
