For the fifth time in almost 30 years, Compton Chamberlayne has won an award from the Campaign to Protect Rural England as the best-kept small village in Wiltshire. The awards were made at a ceremony held in the village on Sunday, when a sign commemorating the win was unveiled by the Lord Lieutenant of Wiltshire, John Bush.
