Thomas Alfred LINTOTT

Thomas Alfred Lintott was born on 7th June, 1890 & he was baptised on 19th November, 1891 at St Saviour, Southwark, Surrey/London. His parents were Thomas & Laura Louisa Lintott. At the time of the baptism, Thomas's father was a fish porter & they were living at Mowbray Buildings.

Thomas Alfred Lintott married Elizabeth Florence Hill on 12th September, 1915 at St David's Church at Islington, London. Thomas was recorded as a 25 year old Packer. A birth for a Thomas A Lintott was registered in the Islington district in the March quarter of 1916 (Mother's maiden name - Hill)

Thomas Alfred Lintott enlisted in the British Army at Shaftesbury Street, N. Thomas Lintott was a Private in the 4th Battalion (City of London) of Royal Fusiliers. His service number was 5099.

Private Thomas Alfred Lintott died on 24th April, 1916. A death for a Thomas A Lintott, aged 25, was registered in the June quarter 1916, in the registration district of Wilton, Wiltshire. He was buried in Compton Chamberlayne cemetery on 26th April, 1916.

William George Norris – Private 4978 of the 4th Battalion (City of London) of Royal Fusiliers died 27th April, 1916 & is also buried in Compton Chamberlayne War Graves Cemetery.

Valleton Redman – Private 5148 of the 4th Battalion (City of London) of Royal Fusiliers died 22nd February, 1916 & is also buried in Compton Chamberlayne War Graves Cemetery.

Norris , Lintott & Redman are buried together in the Front Row – plot numbers 10, 11 & 12.
