THE ELECTRIC LIGHT

Mr Charles Penruddocke, of Compton Park, has his drawing-room brilliantly lighted with the electric light, chromozone batteries being used for the purpose. These batteries have the great recommendations of being cheap, simple, and easy to manage. They run for a week when charged, and give a current of great steadiness and brilliancy, which can be regulated at will, according to the number of lamps needed. Incandescent lamps have been fitted to the pulpit and reading-desk at Compton Chamberlayne Church, so that the light can be switched on by the clergyman when he pleases.
