





Allen had 5 siblings, Keith David 1900-1981; Dorothy Agnes 1902-1969; Archibald H. 1904; Colin Edric 1907-1982; Norman C. 1910 & Laurence G. 1912
Allan was buried on 24th October with full military honours
Allan left a will leaving all his estate to his father
Allan Ernest Evans was entitled to British War Medal only as he had not entered a Theatre of War. A Memorial Scroll (July, 1921) & Memorial Plaque (November, 1922) were sent to his father.
