

## Kellys Directory Extract 1915 Neston



**NESTON** is an ecclesiastical parish, formed in 1866, from the civil parish of Corsham, and comprises the hamlets of Corsham Side, Moor Green, Westwells, Green Hill, and Elley Green. The parish is in the North Western division of the county, Chippenham hundred, union, petty sessional division, and county court district, and in Chippenham rural deanery, North Wilts archdeaconry and Bristol diocese. Corsham Side, the principal hamlet, is about 2 miles southwest from Corsham station on the Swindon and Bath section of Great Western railway, 6 south-west from Chippenham, and 5 north-west from Melksham. The church of SS Philip and James, built in 1865/6, and opened 1st May 1866 is an edifice of stone in the Early English style, consisting of chancel and nave and a turret containing one bell; the stained east window and four other stained windows in memory of his wife, were presented by A C Mitchell esq: there are 260 sittings. The register dates from the year 1866. The living is a vicarage, net yearly value £180 in the gift of G P Fuller esq and others, and held since 1896 by the Rev. John Chugg MA of Corpus Christi College, Cambridge. Here is a Baptist (Ebenezer) chapel, built in 1860, and a meeting house of the Plymouth Brethren. Neston Park is the seat of George Pargiter Fuller esq JP, who is the principal landowner. Neston Club and Institute, built in 1897, contains reading, billiard and recreation rooms, and a skittle alley: there is house for the caretaker attached. The population in 1911 was 988.

**Post & M O Office:** Mrs Jane Swain, sub-postmistress. Letters from Corsham, Wilts, arrive at 7.30am & 7.35pm, Sundays, 7.30am; dispatched at 8.50am and 7.30pm; Sundays dispatched at 8.50am. Corsham, 2 miles distant, is the nearest telegraph office: Atworth, 1 mile distant, the nearest telegraph office for Neston Park.

**Wall Letter Boxes:** West Wells, cleared at 6.40am & 6.30pm, Sundays, 6.40am; Corsham Side, cleared at 8.35am & 6.45pm; Sundays, 8.35am.

**Elementary School** (mixed), Corsham Side: built in 1861 and enlarged in 1885 for 211 children, and again in 1903 for 250 children. John Porter Inkpen, master; Miss Lily Smith, infants' mistress.
