In the name of God Amen The last day of April Anno Domini one thousand six hundred and tenn I Edward Butler of Corsham in the county of Wilts and dioces of Sarum Taylor doe here make my last will and testament in manner and forme followinge that is to say first I commend my soule into the handes of Almighty god my maker and redeemer trustinge to be saved by the merrittes of the death and passion of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ and my body I commend unto the earth until the resurrecion of the Inste Secondlie all my worldly goodes which the Lord hath lente me to use in this life I dispose as followeth first unto the parish Church of Corsham I give and bequeath five shillinges Item unto the Ringers which shall Ringe at my burial I give five shillinges Item unto Catherine my daughter I give and bequeath tenn pounds to be paide unto her when she shall come to be of the full age of seaventeene yeares by my executor Item unto Elizabeth my daughter I give and bequeath tenn poundes to be paide unto her she shall come to be the full age of seaventeene yeares to be pade unto him by my executor when she shall comme to be the full age of seaventeene yeares Item unto Francis my Sonne I give and bequeath tenn poundes to be pade unto him by my executor when she shall comme to be the full age of seaventeene yeares Item unto my sonne Francis I give and bequeath my standing bedsreade one coffer and my chayer All the reste of my goodes cattells and chattrlls whatsoever
