

## Post Office Directory Extract 1875 Corsley



**Corsley** is a parish in the Southern division of the county, hundred, union and county court district of Warminster, diocese and archdeaconry of Salisbury, and rural deanery of Wylye, situated on the borders of Somersetshire, 4 miles north-west from Warminster and south-west from Westbury, and 3 east from Frome.

The church of St Margaret has been rebuilt with funds supplied partly by the late Marquis of Bath and partly by public subscription. It is of stone, in the Early English style, with a square tower. The register dates from 1686. The living is a rectory, value £215, with residence, and including 95 acres of glebe, in the gift of the Marquis of Bath, and held by the Rev. James Hay Waugh, M.A., of Hertford College, Oxford.

A national schoolhouse was erected in 1846, and is now (1875) being enlarged. Here are two chapels, one for Baptists and one for Wesleyans. Sturford House is the seat of Colonel the Hon. Percy Robert B Feilding, C.B., J.P.

The charities amount to £11 yearly.

The Marquis of Bath is lord of the manor and principal landowner.

The soil is clay; subsoil, sand. The land is partly arable and partly pasture.

The area is 2,580 acres; gross estimated rental, £5,785; rateable value, £5,057; the population in 1871 was 1,196.

The village of **Chapmanslade** is partly in this parish and partly in the new parish of **Dilton Marsh**, which see.

**Eustace, Waters, Landhurst, Widbourne Springs, Widbourne Middle, Long Edge, Dartford** and **Temple** are hamlets in the parish of Corsley.
