

## Borough Petty Sessions - Wednesday 8th July 1874

**TRANSFER OF LICENSES** --- On the application of Mr. N. Tarrant, the license of the Old Crown Inn, in New Park Street, was transferred from himself to Mr. W. H. Berry of Coate; and on the application of Mr. N. Tarrant, trustee of the late Joseph Hutchins, the license of the Nag's Head Inn was transferred to his widow, who was unable through illness to attend personally

**GAME LICENSE** --- the application of Mr. B. Dangerfield, fishmonger and Poulterer, for a renewal of his game license was granted.

**THE BEAR HOTEL COMPANY (LIMITED)** --- Mr. H. K. Norris applied for a temporary transfer of the license of the Bear Hotel from Mr. Frederick Sylvester to Mr. H. Bertram, brother to one of the contractors at the Crystal Palace, who has been engaged by this newly-formed company as manager, and the application was at once granted

**EJECTMENT** --- Mr. W. Day, solicitor, made an application for an ejectment to recover possession of a coal yard in the Green, in occupation of James Williams, and belonging to Messrs. Slope and Marvin, mortgagees. Mr. Day proved the tenantcy by attornment and the notice to give up possession and said that the defendant had already given up possession of the land. The Bench made an order of ejectment in 21 days, which was the earliest possible date under the Act 1 and 3 Vic. Cap. 74.

**ASSAULTING A WIFE** --- William Smart, was summoned by his wife, Jane Smart, for assaulting her, but, Mr. Dring said the case was not a very serious one, and as neither party appeared, it was withdrawn.
