The weather has been remarkably fine since our last for completing the harvest, and to this circumstance may be attributed a considerable depression in the wheat trade. – With the exception of one prime sample of white, which obtained 29s., the sales that were effected were from 2s. to 3s. a quarter under the prices of last week; but to this reduction several farmers would not submit, so that some quantity remained unsold. We had an abundant supply.

We continue without any new samples of barley.

There was a large quantity of vetches and rye, which scarcely maintained late prices. Old beans are from 21s. to 22s. and new from 20s. to 21s. We are happy to hear from different quarters that the disease in potatoes is somewhat arrested.

Notwithstanding we were very abundantly supplied with Wheat today, nearly the whole was readily cleared, at an abundance(?) of [-----]. A prime sample of red wheat, for seed obtained [-----], but the highest price for grinding was about 30s.

Barley is now offering for malting – and for the best parcels 43s. is offered, but the holders refused to part with them under 44s. On the average good samples sold at from [44s, to-----].

Beans sell readily at 2s. a sack more money(?)—the dealers having given 23s. Peas also are higher, to the amount of [--]. Vetches [-----] at from [2—to 2—s.]
