TRIENNIAL ELECTION OF  
**COUNTY COUNCILLORS**

TO BE HELD

**ON SATURDAY, THE 7th DAY OF MARCH, 1925**

**TAKE NOTICE**

1. --- That an Election of one County Councillor for Each of the Electoral Divisions of the said County, specified in the Schedule subjoined, will be held on the SEVENTH Day of MARCH 1925.
2. --- That Candidates in any Electoral Division must be nominated by writing, subscribed by two County Electors of the Division, as Proposer or Seconder, and by eight other such County Electors as assenting to the Nomination.
3. --- That Candidates must be duly qualified for the Office to which they are nominated and the Nomination Paper must state the surname and other names of the person nominated, with his abode and description.
4. --- That each Candidate must be Nominated by a separate Nomination Paper.
5. --- The every person who forges a Nomination Paper, or delivers any Nomination Paper knowing the same to be forged, will be guilty of a misdemeanour, and be liable to imprisonment for any term not exceeding six months with or without hard labour.
6. --- That Forms of Nomination Papers may be obtained personally or by letter at the office of the **DEPUTY RETURNING OFFICER, MR. E. LI. GWILLIM, SOLICITOR, MARLBOROUGH**
7. --- That Nomination Papers in respect of any Electoral Division must be **DELIVERED** (not sent by post) by the **CANDIDATE** himself, or by his **PROPOSER** or **SECONDER**, at the place specified for that Electoral Division in the Schedule subjoined, before **FIVE O'CLOCK IN THE AFTERNOON OF FRIDAY, the TWENTY-SEVENTH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1925.**
8. --- That the Returning Officer or his Deputy will attend at the respective places specified in the Schedule subjoined on **SATURDAY, the TWENTY-EIGHTH DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1925,** for a sufficient time between the hours of **TWO** and **FOUR O'CLOCK** in the afternoon, to hear and decide objections to Nomination Papers.

**TAKE NOTICE.** --- That all persons who are guilty of Bribery, Treating, Undue Influence, Personation, or other Corrupt Practices, or any Illegal Practice, as the said Election Will, on conviction of such offence, be liable to the Penalties mentioned in that behalf in "The Municipal Elections (Corrupt and Illegal Practices) Act, 1884," "The Ballot Act, 1872," and the Acts amending the said Acts.

**ALSO TAKE NOTICE.** ---- That by "The Parliamentary Elections (Returning Officers') Act, 1875, it is provided that every person having any claim against a Returning Officer for work, labour, materials, services, or expenses, in respect of any contract made with him, by or on behalf of the Returning Officer shall not be liable in respect of anything which is not duly stated in such Particulars.
