Devizes

Devizes is a municipal and parliamentary borough, market, union, and assize town, railway station, and military centre, situated on the old road from London to Bath and Bristol, nearly in the centre of the county, of which it is the secondary capital, and capital of North Wilts. It is a polling place for the Northern division of the county, in the hundred of Potterne and Cannings, diocese of Salisbury, archdeaconry of Wilts, and rural deanery of Potterne, 88 miles west from London by road, 23 north from Salisbury, 6 north from Market Lavington, 7 south from Calne, 7 east from Melksham, and 20 east from Bath.

It stands on top of a hill, which seems widened and flattened out, forming a sort of tableland of considerable extent and elevation, which land stretches far away to the west. The town is 500 feet above the level of the sea, and from its lofty and exposed situation is subject to winds from every point of the compass, hence the air is often cold, piercing and sharp, but dry and salubrious. The nature of the soil varies considerably from the more southern and western parts of the county. In the latter stone is abundant, while here all traces of it are lost. In this district is found the green sand, one of the beds lying between the chalk and the oolites, which is very porous and of great thickness. As the water for the use of the town is wholly obtained from wells, it is difficult to get a good supply without penetrating to a great depth. A vast number of fossils are found about here.

The town is of great but uncertain antiquity, some believing it to be Roman. It is not, however, mentioned in "Domesday Book," but it is thought then to have been called "Kainningham," or the chief town in the manor of "Kannings." The borough of Devizes obtained its first charter from the Empress Maud, the daughter of Henry I. It was afterwards confirmed by her son Henry II. Two members were returned to Parliament from the time of Edward I, but by the "Representation of the People Act, 1867," one only is now returned. The municipal and parliamentary boroughs are co-extensive, are from north-east to south-west, 2 miles long, 1 mile broad, and comprise the parishes of St John the Baptist and St Mary the Virgin, part of St James or Southbroom, and part of the parish of Rowde. For municipal purposes it is divided into two wards, one called South Ward and the other North. It is governed by a mayor, 6 aldermen and 18 town councilors.

A branch of the Wilts, Somerset and Weymouth railway enters the town, connecting it with the Great Western railway at Chippenham.

The Kennet and Avon canal winds through the valley below the town, and is carried over a hill by a series of twenty-nine locks, and after passing Devizes to the north-west, takes its course along the country, joining the river Kennet at Hungerford. It affords the means of sending goods to the eastern and western parts of the kingdom, and was commenced in 1794 and finished in 1805.

The church of St John the Baptist is a Norman structure, in the form of a Latin cross, with a rectangular tower (containing 8 bells) rising from the intersection. It has a chancel, transepts, nave, aisles and two chapels east of the transepts. There are several marble monuments to the Heathcote and Sutton families. The church is 126 feet long, 68 feet wide, and the tower stands 73 feet high. The register dates from the sixteenth century.

The church of St Mary is for the most part Perpendicular, but with some remains of Norman work in the chancel, and a fine arch at the south porch, and has a chancel, nave, aisles and a square tower containing 6 bells. Four pinnacles are at the western extremity of the building. The church is 132 feet long, 65 feet wide and the tower is 91 feet high. The register dates from the sixteenth century.

The living of Devizes is a rectory, yearly value £518, with residence, in the gift of the Lord Chancellor. It comprises the parishes of St John the Baptist and that of the Blessed Virgin Mary, being quite distinct from one another for civil

matters, but forming a united rectory. Designated as the rectory of St John the Baptist with the chapel of the Blessed Virgin Mary annexed, it is held by the Rev. John Hart Burges, D.D., of Trinity College, Dublin.

St Peter's church, on the Bath road, opposite the Militia Stores, was built in 1866. It consists of chancel, nave and vestry. All seats in the church are free. The district assigned to this church is taken out of the parishes of Bishops Cannings and Rowde, and had in 1871 a population of 857. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £50, in the gift of the Bishop of Salisbury, and held by the Rev. Henry Augustus Louis Grindle, M.A., of St Mary Hall, Oxford.

In 1865 a Roman Catholic Church (St Mary's) was finished on a site by the banks of the canal. It is a small Gothic building, 60 feet long and 23 feet wide. There is a school for the poor; also near the church is a convent containing six nuns, sisters of St Joseph.

There are three chapels for Baptists, one each for Independents and Wesleyans and a Friend's Meeting House.

The following charities have been founded for educational purposes by benevolent donors now deceased Wyld's foundation for 5 boys Woodroffe's foundation for 10 boys Bancroft's foundation for 20 boys Eyle's foundation for 6 boys Imber's for girls The "Bear Club" educates 30 boys and is supported by voluntary subscriptions, the school being held at a building called the "Church Library" in Maryport street.

There are two Town schools for boys and girls, one British school for boys and girls and two Infant schools.

The endowed charities for distribution amount to £125 yearly, besides almshouses for 7 persons.

A Government School of Art has been established, which is held in the Grand Jury room of the Assize Courts.

Devizes is the head-quarters of the Wiltshire Friendly Society, agencies of which are established in all parts of the county.

There are many spacious and handsome buildings and shops, which are mostly of red brick. The market place, of a triangular form, is in a central position, and is connected with the main street, which runs off into the Bath road. Several other streets diverge from the market place, and they are altogether laid out in a very curious manner, one back street being almost semicircular. The town is well paved, drained, watched and lighted with gas. The Gasworks are the property of the Town Council as the urban sanitary authority. A large and extensive corn and cattle market is held every Thursday, which is the mainstay of the town. In 1814, a Market Cross was erected, at the expense of Lord Viscount Sidmouth, who was recorder of the borough for 30 years, and represented it in six successive parliaments previous to his elevation to the peerage. It is built of Bath stone. The lower part is square and plain with a buttress at each angle crowned with a pinnacle. The spire is octagonal, tastefully decorated with architectural ornaments.

The Corn Exchange was erected and opened on the 3rd December 1857, partly by voluntary subscription and by a rate on the town; it is a stone building, 112 feet by 46 broad. The front consists of four Corinthian columns supporting a handsome cornice, and on the centre is a statue of Ceres with agricultural emblems, by Thorp of Leeds, and presented by Christopher Darby Griffith, esq., then M.P. for the borough. A portion of the roof is of glass. The building is well ventilated and from its prominent position is great ornament of the town. There is also a commodious market for the accommodation of dealers in poultry, butter and vegetables, which was rebuilt and enlarged in 1830, and is well supplied on Thursdays. In November 1862, a monthly cheese market was established, which has become an important one.

The fairs are on the 20th and 21st of April, and 20th and 21st of October, for cattle, toys and pedlery and are held on the Green. Candlemas fair, February 14th, is held in Monday Market street.

The Odd Fellows have erected a spacious building in Maryport Street, at a cost of about £2,400. It contains a large room in which the society holds their meetings, and which is let for balls, public entertainments and concerts.

Here are the extensive works of Messrs Brown & May, agricultural engineers; also a tobacco and snuff manufactory.

The Board of Guardians meets every alternate Tuesday at the Union House, which is situated in Devizes.

The Epiphany sessions for the county, and the Spring assize, are held here; also the petty sessions for the borough and for that part of the county in the Devizes division.

The County Assize Courts, situated in Northgate street, were erected in 1835. They form an extensive building, comprising a centre, with wings, in the Grecian style, having a pediment, supported by four Ionic columns resting on an elevated base, which is approached by a flight of steps.

The Town Hall is a handsome building. The front forms a segment of a circle, with four pillars of the Ionic order. In the upper part is the Council Chamber of the Corporation, the Grand Jury Room and the Assembly Room. The latter is a very handsome room and is splendidly decorated.

On the Bath road stands the County Gaol. It is near the borders of the canal, was built in 1810, and is polygonal shape, the governor's house standing in the centre.

The Saving Bank, a large and handsome stone building, in the style prevalent in the reign of James I, was erected in the year 1848, near the Town Hall. It comprises spacious and commodious bank and waiting-rooms, with a large board-room. The remainder of the building forms the residence of the actuary. The bank is open for the transaction of business every Thursday from 11 to 1 o'clock. A large business is transacted the accumulated funds amounting to £65,486. In the same building a Penny Bank has since been started. It is open every Tuesday from 12 to 1, and has been very successful.

The Cottage Hospital is in New Park road and contains six beds. The Hospital for infectious diseases is situated near the union workhouse and contains four beds. The North Wilts Dispensary for the homeopathic treatment of disease is in Monday Market street.

A Literary and Scientific Institution was established in 1833.

The Museum of the Wiltshire Archaeological and Natural History Society is a stone building, situated in Long street, which was formally opened by Gabriel Goldney, esq., M.P., the president of the Society, on the 8th September 1874. The purchase of the property, and the cost of its adaptation to its present purpose, has been met by a special subscription from the members. The museum contains the Archaeological and Natural History collections of the Society and a valuable library of books.

Devizes having been constituted a military centre, barracks are in course of erection on the London road. The building will be in the Early English style and is to be completed in July 1876. Mr J Finch, of Plymouth, is the contractor. There will be accommodation for 228 single men, 32 married, 8 officers, 2 field-officers, quarter-master and an infirmary top contain 28 patients.

The Militia Stores, on the Bath road, are an extensive range of buildings, affording stores, quarters and cottages for a staff of 28 sergeants and 10 drummers.

The 5th Wilts Rifle Volunteers have their head-quarters here, the total force numbering some 67 members.

The Wilts County Lunatic Asylum was opened on the 19th September 1851; T H Wyatt, esq., architect. It is of Bath stone, in the Italian style, situated within 1 mile of the Town Hall. The site is considerably elevated above the level of the adjacent valley of the Avon, though rather less so than the town of Devizes itself. It is well sheltered, and on the north-east and east, the hill of Etchilhampton, which rises at a distance of about a mile, affords protection from the cold winds which blow from three quarters. The quantity of land purchased for the asylum consists of nearly 65 acres, all of which are now in actual occupation. The building at present contains beds for 480 patients.

There are three Newspapers published in Devizes; the "Devizes Gazette", the "Wiltshire Independent" and the "Devizes Advertiser."

The town was the residence of Sir Thomas Lawrence in his youthful days, his parents having kept the Bear Hotel.

To the north-east is Roundway Down, the abrupt termination of a long ridge of chalk hills stretching westwards from Marlborough. On its brow, and nearly overlooking the town, are the remains of an ancient earthwork or Roman station.

In a picturesque and romantic situation, to the west of the borough, formerly stood the ancient and celebrated Castle of Devizes, built in the reign of Henry I, by Roger, Bishop of Salisbury. Old writers say that, for magnificence, extent and strength, this castle had not its equal in Europe. It seems that, in 1139, Stephen, being jealous of the power of this warlike prelate, sent his minister, William D'Ypres, to lay siege to this castle. It was obstinately defended by Nigel, Bishop of Ely, a nephew of Roger, but Stephen, under the threat of hanging the son of Roger, obtained possession, and found a treasure therein of 40,000 marks, besides other valuables. In 1140 Stephen was defeated and taken prisoner at the Battle of Lincoln. The castle was surrendered to the Empress Maud, but she could not long retain it, for in 1141 she found herself so closely besieged in Winchester that she was compelled to flee to Devizes in man's apparel. Here there was no more safety, and allowing herself to be enclosed in a bier she passed out unsuspected, making her retreat good to Gloucester.

Prince (afterwards King) John held the castle of Devizes for his brother Richard during his absence in the Holy Land. In 1223 Hubert de Burgh, the minister of Henry III, was prisoner here, but effected his escape to the high altar of St John's church, from which he was dragged by the soldiers. The parties engaged being excommunicated by the Bishop of Salisbury, he was restored to the sanctuary of the church. The king, intent upon his destruction, endeavoured, by cutting off the supply of provisions, to starve him to death, but he eventually effected his escape to Wales.

These strongholds of the feudal lords proved so troublesome to the reigning sovereign of the time that many kings, from Henry II to Henry VII, endeavoured to destroy or disarm them. It is thought that during the stern rule of the latter monarch this building was dismantled or partially destroyed. It must, however, have been in a state of good preservation in the time of Henry VIII, for Leland speaks of it as a "goodlye building," and as a "worke of incredible coste." But Lampard, in 1569, says---"from being the most gorgeous in Christendom, it is now the most decayed." Camden, in 1586, speaks to the same effect; the stupendous walls are now broken down and crumbled into ruins.

At the time of the great civil wars, this neighbourhood was the scene of a desperate conflict between the Parliamentarians, under Sir William Waller, and the Royalists, commanded by Lord Wilmot, on the 22nd of September 1643. The king, for some considerable time after, held the castle and garrison of Devizes, and contemplated concentrating most of his forces here, or in the neighbourhood. On the 23rd September 1645 Cromwell in person, accompanied by Fairfax, appeared before the town, when the governor, Sir Charles Lloyd, was forced speedily to capitulate; after which, by order of Parliament, the castle was destroyed, and the fortification of Devizes razed to the ground. This property is now in the possession of Robert Valentine Leach, esq. There is a castellated building standing on a portion of the site of the ancient erection, and which has been greatly enlarged, and the grounds by which it is surrounded improved during the last few years, at great cost, by the present proprietor. The modern building still retains the name of Devizes Castle.

Southbroom, or St James, is to the east of the town, and partly within the borough. It was formerly a chapelry attached to the parish of Bishop's Cannings, but in 1832 it was made a separate ecclesiastical parish.

The church of St James stands within the borough, on the Green. It was rebuilt in 1834, excepting the tower, which is thought to be as old as the time of Henry V. It is square, much ornamented at the upper part, is 67 feet high, stands at the west end of the church, and contains 4 bells. The church is 85 feet long and 60 feet wide. The register dates from the seventeenth century. The living is a vicarage, yearly value £177, in the gift of the vicar of Bishop's Cannings, and held by the Rev. Stafford Tordiffe, M.A., of Exeter College, Oxford.

The National school was established in 1834. The landowners are Mrs Colston, the Crown, A Meek, esq., Miss Ewart and N Taylor, esq.

The area is 2,648 acres and the population in 1871 was, including asylum and workhouse, 2,785, of which 1,746 are within the borough of Devizes.
