



Dinton 1800-1849

1801

On Thursday night died, almost suddenly, Farmer John King, of Dinton, in this county. He was at our market on the preceding Tuesday, apparently in good health. **Salisbury and Winchester Journal, Monday, 18 May 1801**

1805

The 1st inst., at Coombe, near Salisbury, in the 73d year of her age, Mrs. Martha Leach Street, late of Dinton, in the county of Wilts. She had a great grandfather who lived to the age of 104, a grandfather on her side to 109, a great grandfather on her husband's side to 106, and a grandfather to 98; all of whom were living with her and her husband's father, on the day of her marriage. She died possessed of a considerable estate, with part of the original building a curious structure, which had been held by her family for many centuries. **Hull Packet, 10 December 1805**

1809

Died At Salisbury, Mrs. Henrietta Wyndham, sister of the late William Wyndham, Esq.; of Dinton. **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 5 October 1809**

Died At Dinton, Mr. Henry Saunders, of Ridge, aged 84, he was accompanied to the grave by six of the parishioners on foot eight miles, whose united age amounted to 480 years. **Bath Chronicle and Weekly Gazette, 10 October 1809**

1817

1821

1837

Married H. G. Biggs, Esq., eldest son of Henry Biggs, Esq., of Stockton House, Wilts, to Mary Anne, daughter of William Wyndham, Esq., of Dinton, same county. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 22 June 1837**

Died December 7, at Dinton, in this county, Laetitia, wife of William Wyndham, Esq. **Devizes and Wiltshire Gazette, Thursday, 14 December 1837**

1838
